

## CALL FOR PAPERS

### *COLLOQUIA*

Colloquia is an academic peer-reviewed journal of literary criticism published by the Institute of Lithuanian Literature and Folklore (Vilnius, Lithuania). Embracing diverse perspectives, topics, and theoretical approaches, it is committed to publishing insightful and innovative scholarship in the field of Lithuanian and Central/East European literatures from the twentieth century to the present day. It also invites articles on theoretical issues of literature, as well as interdisciplinary studies. The journal is published twice a year (printed and online) and accepts scholarly articles, book reviews, interviews, discussions, academic letters, archival material, or any other format that best fits the topic, year-round. Scholars interested in reviewing recent publications should contact the editorial board at [colloquia@liti.lt](mailto:colloquia@liti.lt).

Colloquia welcomes articles in the Lithuanian, English, French, German, and Russian languages. Articles should range in length from 20 000 to 40 000 characters (with spaces) and reviews should not exceed 20 000 characters. Articles must be accompanied by keywords, brief annotation (1000 characters) and an abstract of 2000 characters.

Manuscripts should be submitted via e-mail to [colloquia@liti.lt](mailto:colloquia@liti.lt). The e-mail should be marked as a submission in the title bar, and, to ensure the integrity of the double-blind peer review process, include two files: (1) the paper with an abstract and keywords, and (2) a separate cover page containing the title of the article, the author's name, phone number, e-mail address, institutional affiliation, and a brief biographical note. The files must be saved in Microsoft Word or Rich Text format.
