



SMALL GENRES OF FOLKLORE : LOCAL CONTEXTS AND COMPARATIVE PARALLELS

In Honour of the 100th Anniversary of Prof. Kazys Grigas

Professor Kazys Grigas (1924-2002) was one of the most eminent Lithuanian folklorists, historians of folklore, and undoubtedly the most famous Lithuanian paremiologist, collector, and populariser of proverbs and proverbial sayings. Having shown Lithuanian proverbs to be a part of the international paremiological compendia, Kazys Grigas highlighted their national character as well as the peculiarities of their linguistic and poetic expression. The books "Lithuanian Proverbs: a Comparative Study" (1976) and "Proverb Parallels: Lithuanian Proverbs with Latvian, Belarusian, Russian, Polish, German, English, Latin, French, and Spanish Equivalents" (1987) have been recognised as fundamental works by the international community of paremiologists. These books along with his other comparative studies have become an indispensable part of research and supplement the paremiological data.

In addition to his achievements in the field of paremiology, Kazys Grigas studied other so-called small genres of folklore, i. e. folklore texts of various kinds, characterised by their short form. These include not only proverbs and proverbial sayings but also riddles, situational expressions, etiquette formulas, beliefs, charms, prayers, curses, fortune-tellings, tongue-twisters, counting-out rhymes, teasing rhymes, onomatopoeia (sound imitations), etc.

On the occasion of the 100th anniversary of professor Kazys Grigas, we invite you to celebrate his life and works, explore their importance for Lithuanian folkloristics and international paremiology, and to share relevant research in the field of small genres of folklore.

Suggested topics include (but are not limited to):

- The influence of personality on the development of folklore studies: life, scientific and cultural activities of Kazys Grigas
- Small genres in the history of folklore studies
- Theoretical and methodological aspects in the study of small genres of folklore
- Importance of context for small genres of folklore
- The international and national character of small genres of folklore
- Tradition and modernity in small genres of folklore
- Small genres and other forms of folklore: cross-genre links
- O Linguistic expression and poetic features of small genres of folklore
- Magical and practical functions of small genres of folklore
- Translation of small genres of folklore
- O Manifestations of small genres of folklore in literature and art
- O Small genres in digital spaces: communication, variation, visualisation



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We invite folklorists, ethnologists, linguists, historians, and other cultural researchers from various institutions worldwide to share their research in relation to the above-mentioned and other relevant topics. Please submit proposals including your name, institution, position, proposed title of your paper, abstract (of maximum 300 words) and short biographical note to the form by September 30, 2023.

Accepted papers will be confirmed by November 1, 2023. Participation is possible both in person and online.

Selected proceedings of the conference will be published after a double-blind peer reviewing process.
